What is Political Science and International Relations?

- Political Science and International Relations is a field of study that focuses
 on the basic dynamics of global politics ranging from psychology to history, from sociology to economics and focuses on the analysis of political,
 economic and socio-cultural relations between states and other global
 actors.
- Within the Department of Political Science and International Relations, it is aimed that students will be able to analyze the global politics by providing students with theoretical knowledge in areas such as political psychology, power and legitimacy, ideologies, political systems, democracy, human rights, politics and society, political economy, civil society, public opinion and pressure groups, political parties, electoral systems, nation-states and non-state actors, security, geopolitics, foreign policy analysis, diplomacy, identity, cooperation, international system, international law, international organizations, globalization, disarmament, environmental issues, ethnic conflicts, energy, and migration.

Our Goal

 The Department of Political Science and International Relations aims to train experts who can interpret the global network of relations that is increasing today within a conceptual framework and follow current developments. In this context, it is aimed to raise individuals who have a good command of world and Turkish issues, proficiency in foreign languages, adopt an analytical mindset, criticize and analyze, constantly renew themselves, are entrepreneurial and willing to question, adopt ethical values and are prone to joint work and democratic participation.

- Analyzing the impact of digitalization on global politics and security
